

Notice Regarding Emergency Measures for Typhoons and Other Severe Weather Conditions

At Rakuyu Junior High School, in the event of weather conditions such as typhoons, if a **Special Warning, Storm Warning, Heavy Rain Warning, or Heavy Snow Warning** is issued for **Kyoto City (Southern Kyoto area, Kyoto City, or Kameoka City)**, we will respond according to the guidelines outlined in points 1 and 2 below.

If you hear any of these four warnings announced on TV, radio, or other media, please be cautious and take appropriate action.

1. Special Warning

- If a *Special Warning* is issued **before school starts**, please stay at home.
Do not come to school until the warning is **lifted** (meaning the weather has slightly improved and the special warning is no longer in effect).
Your safety is the top priority.
- If a *Special Warning* is issued at **midnight (12:00 a.m.)**, school will be **temporarily closed** for the day.

2. Storm Warning, Heavy Rain Warning, or Heavy Snow Warning

- If any of these three warnings are issued at **2:00 p.m.**, school will be **temporarily closed** for the day.

Additional Notes:

- ② If the warning is **lifted before 2:00 p.m.**, regular classes will be held. Please come to school as usual.

- ② If a warning is issued **during class hours**, students will remain at school until it is confirmed safe. The school will decide whether students can go home and will inform everyone accordingly.

Emergency Measures in Case of Earthquake

At **Rakuyu Junior High School**, if an earthquake of **seismic intensity 5 lower or higher** occurs in **Kyoto City**, the school will respond as follows. Please stay informed through **TV, radio, and the internet**.

1. If the earthquake occurs before school starts

(1) When a seismic intensity of 5 lower or higher is observed:

- The **next school day** will be treated as a **temporary closure (no school)**.
- This applies not only to **Shimogyo Ward**, where the school is located, but to **any ward in Kyoto City**.
- If the earthquake occurs **after school hours but before midnight**, the **next day** will be a temporary closure.
- If the earthquake occurs **between midnight and the time of school arrival**, **that day** will be a temporary closure.
- If an earthquake occurs **after returning home on a holiday or the day before a holiday**, the **next school day after the holiday** will be a temporary closure.
- If safety is confirmed and classes can be held, details such as **class schedules** will be announced on the **school website**.

• (In this case, "holiday" refers to regular days off such as **Saturdays and Sundays**.)

(2) If the school is temporarily closed:

- The **reopening date** will be announced after confirming the **damage status** of the school and surrounding areas.

2. If the earthquake occurs during commuting to school

- The school will **immediately close temporarily (no school)**.

- Decisions regarding **whether students should return home** will be made based on:

- The condition of **commuting routes**
- The status of **public transportation**
- The **time required to return home**
- The **situation at each student's home**

- The school will **coordinate with families** to make appropriate decisions.
